Senior Deputy County Counsel Kevin Ready reported the following:

Jury reached a verdict in the eminent domain case in the amount of \$406,000.

Government Code § 54956.9(a) Sustainable Transportation Advocates of Santa Barbara v. SBCAG (2 cases)

A judgment has been entered by the court and a writ has been issued by the court. Item 6B on the agenda today are actions resulting from the judgment and writ. The Board also directed counsel, at their discretion, to move for sanctions against the plaintiff and plaintiff's counsel regarding certain pending motions before the court.

Kellam de Forest, Pearl Chase Society, addressed the board on the diversion of funding to the Cold Springs Bridge project.

Judith Ishkanian addressed the board on traffic safety in the Highway

101/Milpas to Hot Springs Road area and the importance of getting the project completed.

Ed Laing, addressed the board on the traffic in the Milpas area of Highway 101 and the diversion of funding to the Cold Springs Bridge project.
