12. ROUTE 154 TRUCK SAFETY

Hold hearing to receive input on consideration of proposal to initiate state legislation to improve safety on Route 154 by restricting truck traffic by size and/or weight.

PUBLIC COMMENT

California Highway Patrol (Captain Jeff Sgobba, Santa Barbara Area Commander; and Assistant Chief Scott Howland, Coastal Division) presented information and statistics on collisions on Highway 154 and also what is considered a hazardous material and may be prohibited.

Beverly Herbert, resident, addressed the board on the traffic in the area of Foothill Road and Highway 154 and also the on/off ramps in the area.

Scott Cramer, General Manager, Certified Freight Logistics, California Trucking Association, addressed the board on trucking roadway and weight restrictions already in place and how the closure of the route could affect the industry.

Bob Field, resident, addressed the board on the number of traffic fatalities on Highway 154. Suggests that the speed limit on the 154 should be 40 mph

Karin Roser addressed the board on Highway 154 and how the public uses it like a high speed highway. Suggested that more stop signs be added at all the major intersections, and evaluate the speed limit on Highway 154.

Motion made to direct staff to take the next steps in pursuing legislation restricting truck use of Highway 154 based on size and weight with the exception of local truck traffic.

13. UNMET TRANSIT NEEDS

Hold hearing and receive public input on unmet transit needs in Santa Barbara County.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Barry Stotts, addressed the board about the history of transit service in North County, noting that the systems are working well and we just need to keep expanding service in North County.

Colleen Klein, Buellton Senior Center, addressed the board on the need for financial support for nonprofit organizations such as senior centers providing dial-a-ride tickets to seniors, or for lower dial-a-ride fares for seniors in the Santa Ynez Valley.

Elizabeth Houston addressed the board about the need for a bus route with bus stops on Depot Street to serve individuals with disabilities at the Vizcaya Apartments in Santa Maria. Currently there are two bus stops on Thornburg Street, but no stops on Depot Street.

Willi Campbell, of the Solvang Senior Center, addressed the board about the need to change the focus of transit service from fixed route back to dial-a-ride service for transit-dependent seniors.

Eldon Kirby, of the Del Cielo Mobile Home Owners Association, addressed the board about the need for a safe pedestrian crossing across Santa Maria Way from the Del Cielo Mobile Senior Estates to the SMAT (Santa Maria Area Transit) bus stop on the west side of Santa Maria Way. He also requested a bench for the bus stop.

Lou Traga of the Independent Living Resource Center addressed the board about the need for public transportation to allow seniors and individuals with disabilities to be active participants in the community. Public transportation not only benefits the individuals, but also the community in which they are contributing members.

Public hearing only therefore no action was taken.
